

The Top 13 Awesome Sights Most NYC Visitors Miss:

- 1) The chinks in the wall of the Morgan Bank Building on Wall Street, the remnants of the first terrorist attack on US soil—in 1920!
- 2) Having a tour guide stand with you and point out all of the points of interest at Ground Zero, including seeing the progress of the 9/11 Memorial and Freedom Tower, the relationship of the World Trade Center site to St. Paul's Chapel, the footprints of the twin towers, and more.
- 3) The SOUP MAN storefront that inspired the Soup Nazi on the SEINFELD TV show.



- 4) The "Miracle on the Hudson" site where Captain Chesley (Sully) Sullenberger landed U.S. Airways Flight 1549 in the Hudson River.
- 5) Grand Central Terminal's Main Concourse ceiling with its "God View" showing the night sky from above, and the Whispering Gallery (NY See The Lights! Only)
- 6) See the subways going over the Manhattan Bridge from the Fulton Ferry Landing in Brooklyn (NY See The Lights! Only)
- 7) The Clock from the Central Park Zoo, highlighted in the movie *Madagascar*.
- 8) The Bishop's Throne in St. Patrick's Cathedral, without which this church could not be called a cathedral. (NY See The Best! Only)

9) The Ground Zero Cross. This was the cross of steel girders found by the workers at the WTC site and kept as a on-site memorial. It will be incorporated into the 9/11 Memorial next year. (NY See The Best! Only)

10) The *Imagine* mosaic at Strawberry Fields in Central Park (Sometimes, you get to meet Gary, "The Mayor of Strawberry Fields")

11) The Titanic Memorial Lighthouse -- A memorial to the passengers, officers and crew who died when the steamship Titanic sank after collision with an iceberg on April 15, 1912.



12) Pier 54 where the Carpathia brought back the Titanic survivors in 1912 and where the Lusitania left on her final voyage in 1915.

13) The former Nabisco headquarters where the Oreo cookie was invented.
